Celebrating Positive Behaviours

As a PC4L - Positive Culture of Learning school we have in place Rewards Systems. We acknowledge and celebrate students for displaying positive behaviours with their learning, expectations, our Values-Kia Kaha-be strong, Kia Maia-be brave, Kia Manawanui-be kind, Kia Angitu-be successful - our Vision-Ki te taumata-Aim for the Best, Learning Powers-KPS Thinker, Explorer, Citizen, Communicator.

These include:

Class DOJO's,

Dojo points are given out to our tamariki for displaying expectations in their learning and everyday interactions in class and in the playground.



<u>Dojo Rewards 2024,</u> Our Poumanawa - Values Wristbands. 100 Dojo points = White Poumanawa wristband, 300= Grey, 500= Blue, 700= Black, and 900 = the

Gold Poumanawa.

Values tickets, students receive these for showing our values during play and lunchtime breaks. Students who get a ticket earn house points.



Principals awards- where students get certificates for displaying the values and learning powers focus. These are given out at fortnightly Friday assemblies. Students also get a Duffy Book.

Recon awards- these are in class awards where tamariki are recognised for displaying the values learning focus of the day. The teacher acknowledges a student for displaying the focus behaviour and then that student gets to choose a peer who they also feel has lived the values focus.




At the end of each term we have Formal assembly where Principal Certificates and Badges are awarded for being a KPS - Citizen, Thinker, Explorer, Communicator.
